### Policy document on the green campus/plastic free campus

[Academic sessions: 2018-19 to 2022-23]

Throughout maintaining a close coordination with the Green Audit team and the NSS unit of the college, IQAC have approved the following resolutions in its meetings between 2018 and 2023 for upholding a Clean and Green Campus:

1. Solar panel need to be installed on the rooftop of our college Building as alternate sources of energy.
2. More LED lights to be installed in our college for conservation of energy.
3. Awareness program to save energy and water will be carried out in the college campus by the NSS unit or other committees to raise student sensitization on this issue.
4. On our college campus, signs and posters emphasizing the message of plastic free campus, conserving water and energy are to be hung in a number of locations.
5. Government General Degree College, Tehatta will approach Tehatta Gram Panchayet to manage different solid wastes (biodegradable and non-biodegradable) on a regular basis.
6. Solid waste produced on the college campus, will be segregated into different containers and disposed off by the Tehatta Gram panchyet's logistics.
7. The college will take the initiative in maintaining a clean and green campus by engaging housekeeping staff to look after the campus gardening and to maintain lavatory cleanliness.
8. Campus will be declared as a plastic free campus. The college will install banners to aware the students about the hindrances of plastic uses.
9. Green Audit will be conducted regularly.
10. Water conservation initiatives will be taken by means of harvesting rainwater that will be used in watering tree plants in the garden.
11. Days like World environment day, World water day, Earth Day etc. will be observed in our college to sensitize our students on clean and green environment and water conservation.
12. College will promote the awareness of the use of bicycles/ battery powered vehicles among the students and staff. The initiatives will be also taken to restrict the entry of automobiles in the college campus.
