


























3. MALE-FEMALE DISTRIBUTION OF TEACHERS FOR THE LAST FIVE ACDEMIC YEARS:




4. MALE-FEMALE DISTRIBUTION OF NON-TEACHING STAFFS FOR THE LAST FIVE ACDEMIC YEARS:





ANALYSIS:

- 1. Arts departments show a higher enrollment of girl students.
- 2. Science departments show a low enrollment of girl students.
- 3. Both number of male and female students reduces significantly from the 1st to 5th semesters.
- 4. Department of Bengali shows the higher enrollment of girl students.
- 5. B.Sc General has the least number of enrolled girl students.
- 6. Male-female ratio is quite high for both teaching and non-teaching members.
- 7. No sports were held in the academic year 2020-21 due to COVID-19. However the cultural events were held via online mode in this particular academic year.
- 8. At present the college does not have any member belonging to the third gender.

ACTIONS TAKEN:

- 1. The ICC operates actively in the college to monitor any form of harassment inside the college premises.
- 2. The topic of 'Gender equity' is present in some or the other form as a part of their syllabus in most Humanities subjects. This part is taught with special attention by the teachers.
- 3. Different scholarship programmes are provided to girl students to increase their enrollment.
- 4. The college has been constantly taking initiaves to provide suitable facilities to girl students.
- 5. The college has obtained a feedback from the students regarding 'Gender Sensitization' to understand their thoughts on gender equity.

CONCLUSION:

The gender audit report gives a vivid idea of the existing male-female ratio among students as well as teachers and non-teaching members. This analysis helps in designing new strategies to promote an environment where both genders are treated with un-biasness and develop mutual respect for each other.
